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#### What will the course involve?

The Level 3 course will be a 2 year course with assessments taking place across the entirety of the two years. There are two exam units, with coursework units completed in and around these.

The written examination units make up 60% of your overall grade and cover a range of topics which are listed below.

#### **Exam units**

- Human Lifespan and Development
- Working in Health and Social Care

#### **Coursework units**

The coursework units you will complete make up the remaining 40% of your final grade, where we expect each student to achieve a distinction in each of the units completed.
