Methods of	There are four exam papers in French. Each paper is equally weighted.
Assessment:	25% Writing – Responding in writing in the target language and translation from English
	into French.
	25% Listening – Understanding and responding to spoken extracts and dictation of short,
	spoken extracts.
	25% Reading – Understanding written texts and translation from French into English.
	25% Speaking – Speaking in response to a photocard, having a conversation and reading
	aloud in French.
