Overview of the subject	Like Jenga blocks you will build your language skills through exposure to topical vocabulary, grammar and improve your pronunciation skills by focussing on the phonics and sounds in German. Speaking German is fun and interactive combined with communicating in writing on topics which develop your understanding of the world. You will also listen to spoken German and develop your comprehension skills by reading and engaging with a variety of written sources.
Methods of	There are four exam papers in German. Each paper is equally weighted.
