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Overview of the subject Methods of Assessment:	Our GCSE Drama offers students the opportunity to explore drama as a practical art form in which ideas and meaning are communicated to an audience through choices of form, style and convention. Component I- Understanding drama 40% of GCSE Written exam: I hour and 45 minutes Component 2- Devising drama 40% of GCSE Devising log (60 marks) Devised performance (20 marks) Component 3- Texts in practice 20% of GCSE Performance of Extract I (20 marks) and Extract 2 (20 marks)	
Key Content and Topics Covered	 Students will understand roles and responsibilities within the theatre and different staging configuration. Students will study a set text by AQA The Crucible and answer 4 questions during the exam on this text. Students will see live theatre and answer a question during the exam on this performance (May 2027) Students will perform a devised performance to an audience and complete a devising log of three sections of coursework, to support the development of this practical work. (June 2026) Students will perform two extracts from the same play text to a visiting examiner (February 2027)
