Key Stage 3

In Key stage three we follow a curriculum where all students in the same year study the same concepts and skills at the same time. We believe that all students can be successful in maths and that every student has the right to be able to be exposed to the same mathematics. Each one of our units starts with the recapping of prior knowledge, moves onto the core steps that students will learn and also includes some extension content (the decision on whether the students are taught the extension content is down to the teacher in the class, not the set that students are in). Topics that involve similar process are grouped together to enable students to apply their learning to a mixture of problems as well as make connections across mathematics. Students are set due to current attainment in the first half term of Year 7 and are taught in ability classes throughout KS3. These are reviewed regularly to make sure that students are in the correct group for them.

Key Stage 4

In Year 10 students move onto their GCSE program of study and the Edexcel Specification. Students in set 1 and 2 follow a higher tier curriculum. Student in sets 3, 4, 5 and 6 follow a foundation tier curriculum. With regards to tier, we will always do what we feel is best for each individual student.

We also offer GCSE statistics and Level 2 Further Maths in the KS4 Option block.

Extra Curricular

All students in set 1 in Year 7 and 8 sit the UK Junior Maths challenge. Selected students in Year 10, 11, 12 and 13 are also entered into the Intermediate and Senior maths challenges. These students are chosen by the class teachers.

We also offer extra-curricular clubs including Chess Club and Uno club at lunchtimes.
